- 15 ounce bag or can tuna, drained
 - 1 cup oat flour
 - 1 Tbsp extra light olive oil
 - 1Tbsp dried catnip
 - 1 egg
 - 1-2 Tbsp water (*can add more if the dough needs to be stickier*)
1. Preheat oven to 350°F and line a baking sheet with parchment paper.
 2. Mix drained tuna, egg, flour, water, olive oil, and catnip until smooth.
 3. Pinch or roll pieces of the dough into "croutons" and place on baking sheet.
 4. Bake about 12-15 minutes until they are dried on top and browned.

Supplies

- 12 pack cardboard soda carton
- Scissors
- X-acto knife
- Glue
- Bamboo skewers
- Crafting feathers
- Duct tape
- 2 pipe cleaners
- Paper towel tube

Steps

1. Remove soda cans from the shorter side panel and re-glue the panel back together.
2. Using scissors or an x-acto knife, cut out one of the longer side panels.
3. Make an inner support post.
4. Use your x-acto knife to cut out circles from the top of the soda carton, avoiding the inner support post.
5. Time to make your toys for your cat to "whack" in the holes! Make sure the ends of your bamboo skewers are not sharp and wrap the pipe cleaners around the skewer. Secure them with tape.
6. Glue feathers to the end so that they stick up, perpendicular to your skewer and will poke out of the holes in the soda box.
7. Time to play!

Maneuver the skewer up through the holes to entice your furrend!
