Sunshine , along with Bruce, is taking a vacation from all the hard work he does at The Cat Clinic.

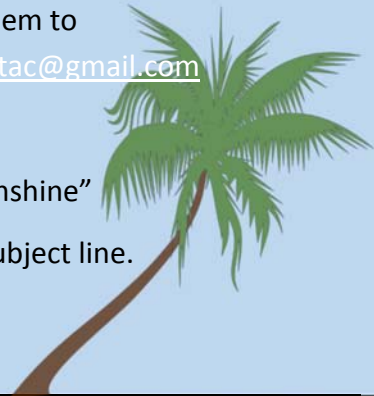

Is Your Cat in Pain?

Is your fur baby in pain?

Nobody wants to see their dog suffering and in pain. However, sometimes it can be very difficult to know for sure whether or not your dog is in pain.



Below are some symptoms:

- Hiding
- Loss of appetite
- Excessive licking and grooming
- Cessation of licking and grooming
- Hunched position
- Closed eyes
- Whiskers down
- Guarding
- Hissing or swatting when the affected area is touched
- Disassociation with the environment

Just like humans, there are many reasons your fur baby may be showing these symptoms, and there are many options to manage and treat your fur baby's pain. Talk with your veterinarian if your pet is showing signs of pain or discomfort to determine the best option for you and your pet.
